**Open Session**

A matter had been raised by Cllr Tindall and was discussed in private session prior to the commencement of the meeting.

Several Parishioners attended the meeting and raised questions during the open session regarding the Parish Website and Tasley Garden Village.

The Chairman responded to all questions.

**Matters arising** Tasley Garden Village

The clerk had obtained information from Tasley Parish Clerk regarding the Regulation 19 document . Councillors would complete a response.

**Reports**

a) **Shropshire Councillor** Cllr.Tindall had called in the application for the Acton Arms. He had also asked for a site meeting with Graham Downes to discuss flooding at Aston Eyre.

b) **Chairman** the Chairman said that matters regarding the Web-site had now been dealt with.

c) **Clerk** A National Census would be held on Sunday 21<sup>st</sup> March and Elections on 6<sup>th</sup> May.

**Correspondence**

**Highways**

The Chairman was concerned that the broken white lines on A458 through Morville were contributing to speeding in the village.

Cllr.Tindall was asked to look into the matter and to enquire about the number of speeding fines issued.

**Planning**

Refusal for Application 20/03303 Provision of paved/hardstanding area at 1 Prestwich Close, Morville.

Application 20/05263/FUL Change of use of land from agriculture to mixed use of glamping and agriculture together with associated works including installation of package treatment plant and parking spaces.

The Parish Council discussed this application and objected to the proposals.

Application 20/04974/FUL Stable Cottage and Top Barn, Upton Cressett, Bridgnorth. Partial demolition and extension to existing Stable Cottage with conversion of existing Top Barn from domestic storage to occupational accommodation. There were no objections

Application 20/03647/OUT Councillors discussed this application and would respond as follows –

Councillors have examined this application and wish to make the following comments. Whilst they wish to see the Acton Arms restored as a thriving village public-house they are concerned that it depends on a small housing development at the rear in order to finance it. They also note that there are no semi-detached or affordable homes included in the plan. Councillors however, are mindful of Morville Parish Council's designation in the SAMDev document – i.e. 'Countryside' - no market dwellings to be built in the parish and Councillors trust that the decision will be upheld.
